http://www.ceoexpress.com/default.asp	This is a great place to start your research. There are hundreds of links to valuable websites and they are all organized into various categories.	Do not use the search engine box... it is the same as using Google. Use the links on the page to bring to good, valuable sites.
http://www.census.gov/	Economic Census, surveys, etc.	Search engine on top or click on "Economic Census" below
http://stats.bls.gov/	Bureau of Labor Statistics	Click on any of the items listed or click "search" and try it that way
http://www.bls.census.gov/cps/cpsmain.htm	A combined project between the BLS and the Census-tracks monthly statistics on the current population	Use the buttons on top right portion of the screen to find what you're looking for
http://www.access.gpo.gov/	A service of the Federal Government Printing Office providing free electronic access to important information produced by the government	Type in search criteria in search engine box on top
http://www.pewinternet.org/	Pew Internet & American Life Project-full of statistics regarding internet use and business technology	Search engine on top left side of site-find article you want and then click "view pdf or html"
http://www.businessweek.com/index.html	Business Week Online offers many recent articles surrounding a large range of current business issues	Use search engine on top right side. If there IS NOT a lock next to the article you want... it's free! If there is, you need to be a member to access it.

http://promomagazine.com/	An excellent site! Mostly articles, but also industry trends, survey results, great statistics	Use "advanced search" in top right corner, or use the drop down under "research" if you're looking for survey results/industry trends
http://www.google.com/trends	This search engine allows you to see what people around the world are interested in by running searches of Google's Web-search traffic. It will tell you how often and which countries search that term the most--also great graphs to show it all! Also, when you type in your search, you will also see related articles on the right hand side involving issues surrounding your keyword.	Just go to the site and use just like a Google search engine... for example, type in "China" and you will see that Hong Kong searches "china" the most, and you will also see related articles
http://scholar.google.com/	This is another search engine provided by Google; however, it only allows credible sources to give you feedback on your search so it provides good, trustworthy information.	Exactly like normal "Google" with better results!
http://www.answers.com/	This site combines the dictionary, almanac and encyclopedia all into one well-formatted search engine	Just create your search in the "Tell me about" box and to find results.
http://online.wsj.com/public/us	The Wall Street Journal Online-if you only want one article=\$4.95 piecemeal. If you want to subscribe for the year, \$99/year if you do not already receive the print version; if you do receive the print version, \$49/month. First two weeks free.	Use the drop down under "research and tools." For articles, use "article search" to see first few paragraphs of the article you are looking for.

http://www.articleworld.net/	This site is very similar to findarticles.com; searches the web for related articles for free	Use the "Google search" in top right hand corner or use the category list on left side of screen; VERY IMPORTANT: click on Search articleworld.net only; not the entire web!
http://www.articlecube.com/	Another site very similar to findarticles.com and articleworld.net	Use the search engine or pick from large list of categories

When you search this site, it will say right next to the article whether or not its free.	Use "Research" search engine. These materials cover U.S. and international agriculture and related topics.	Use search engine at top of webpage. Click on either a report or a data set to get your statistics.
http://home.core.com/web/start	Basically another search engine--but really channels keywords well, great articles and graphs	Do not use the search engine box, but rather click the "search" magnifying glass. Once you have the new search box, make sure home.core.com is selected.

http://www.cnn.com/	CNN search engine does a very good job finding articles on many different topics.	Use search engine; however, do not use "sponsored links"-- rather look underneath those and use "search results"
http://news.bbc.co.uk/	The BBC offers a wealth of information and articles, for free	Use search engine in top right corner. All information is sponsored by the BBC so your results are resourceful.
http://www.chicagobusiness.com/	Use this site to search for data-filled articles.	Use the "Search Crain's" box for general searches or search for articles by industry in second search box below on left hand side (middle).
http://www.forbes.com/	This site offers many business-related articles and news. Membership is FREE, but you have to register to access to information.	Two search engine boxes: 1. search by keyword, or 2. search by industry/interest.

http://www.bizstats.com/	This is a great website for statistics within an industry. It can be used for benchmarking your current client against the industry it is in. Great graphs/stats/etc. This site is especially helpful for finding your industry's operating profit and related expenses.	No search engine box. As soon as you get to the site, scroll down.
